 - i. MOTION: To support a pilot "Beach Express" line, run by LA County Metro, connecting weekend travelers on the soon-to-be-open Expo Line Phase 1 from Venice/Robertson to Venice Beach, traveling along Venice Blvd.
MOTION: To support the Motor Avenue Improvement Association's proposal asking the City to:
1. Remove items #18-21 of the CCNTMP associated with setting a 600 vehicle per hour cap during AM & PM peak hours on Motor Avenue by altering signal timing and installing "No Left Turn" LED sign at Motor and National, **2.** Instruct LADOT to adjust all signal timing that has been altered to meet the 600-vehicle per hour cap back to its original condition, and **3.** Remove "no right turn" restriction for westbound traffic on National Blvd at Motor Ave
 - h) **Planning and Land Use Report** (MacMenamin)
 - i. MOTION: Support the proposed amendment to City ordinance expanding bicycle parking requirements to include some multi-family residential development; increase the amount of bicycle parking required for new development and additions to commercial, institutional & industrial uses. We encourage development in Palms to exceed the minimum requirements in this ordinance based on the high density of Palms and high usage of bicycles in and through the neighborhood.
 - ii. MOTION: Request that the City earmark funds from the sale of Old Fire Station 34 to projects in Palms
