Therefore, the Palms Neighborhood Council strongly recommends the City of Los Angeles and Metro work together to provide or create incentives leading to the provision of parking at or adjacent to all light rail stations.*

*MOTION: Whereas, the Palms Neighborhood Council recognizes that Park-and-Ride options with convenient public transportation connection to light rail will only increase ridership and its benefits to the urban environment,
Therefore, the Palms Neighborhood Council strongly recommends the City of L.A. and Metro work together to provide or create incentives leading to the provision of off-site Park-and-Ride lots design to geographically expand ridership for light rail and subway lines.*

- 1) LAPD Anti-theft "Clubs for Cars" Program
MOTION: The Palms Neighborhood Council authorizes expenditure of up to \$1,000 to assist LAPD in the Clubs for Cars program, earmarked for cars in Palms.
