II. AGENDA (2 minutes)

- a. **MOTION:** Authorize the Palms Neighborhood Council to join the Neighborhood Council Sustainability Alliance (NCSA) and be represented by a member of the Green Committee to be designated by the Green Committee.
- b. **MOTION:** The Transportation Committee calls on the Palms Neighborhood Council to submit a letter urging Councilmember Paul Koretz, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, and other city entities as needed to put in place speed bumps on Mentone Ave. between National Blvd./Rose Ave. and Woodbine Street in a timely fashion.
- c. **MOTION:** The Transportation Committee calls on the Palms Neighborhood Council to submit a letter asking Councilmember Paul Koretz, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, and other city entities as needed to study the viability of the second lane turn and the general safety of National Blvd. at Woodbine Street and execute a solution in a timely fashion.
- d. **FUNDING MOTION:** Authorize the Palms Neighborhood Council to spend up to \$75 on signs for the Woodbine Park basketball court fence that ask neighbors to “Please Respect Our Dogs Here Between ___ AM and ___ AM” with final language to be determined by the Green Committee and the local dog community.
- e. **DISCUSSION:** Transportation Committee led discussion on a “Safe Passenger Loading Zone” pilot project and an update on “Increased Expo Line Service”.

III. Adjournment (End time is approximately 9:00 p.m. or shortly thereafter)

Time allocations for agenda items are approximate and may be shortened or lengthened at the discretion of the President. Public comment will be taken for each motion as well as for any item in the consent agenda prior to Board action. The public is requested to fill out a “Speaker Card” to address the Assembly on any item of the agenda prior to the Assembly taking action on an item. Comments from the public on Agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the Agenda that is within the Assembly’s subject matter jurisdiction will be heard during the Public Comment period. Public comment is limited to 1 to 2 minutes per speaker, at the discretion of or unless waived by the Assembly. In the interest of addressing all items on the agenda, time limits for individual comments and discussion may be set at the discretion of the President. All items on the consent agenda will be

determined by a single Committee vote and without Committee discussion. Committee members may request that any item be removed from the consent agenda and considered individually at any time prior to that vote.
